PLEASE FOLLOW THIS GUIDANCE WHILST USING THE PLAY AREA



DO NOT use play areas if you have symptoms of Coronavirus



Wash your hands thoroughly before & after your visit



If the play area is too busy Please come back later



Follow current social distancing guidelines



Bring your own hand sanitiser or wipes to use while at the play areas



DO NOT touch your face. Catch any coughs/sneezes in a tissue and bin



Clean your equipment before/after use

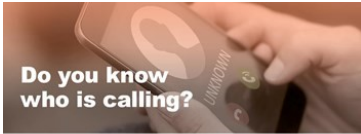


DO NOT consume food/drink in this play area

Lyonshall Parish Council has **REOPENED** the playground after considering its responsibilities for safety and the current risks involved. For this to happen all users will take full responsibility for themselves whilst using the playground— Please read and stick to these rules and guidelines as advertised in the playground and on the website.

- **Parental guidance at all times**
- **Maintaining social distancing**
- **Sanitise/wash your hands before and after using the play equipment**
- **Don't touch your face after touching any of the surfaces**
- **Do not take or eat food or drink in the playground**
- **Take all your litter home with you**

Whilst all possible practical measures have been put in place to ensure safety, scientific advice suggests that the COVID-19 virus can survive for up to several days on some hard surfaces. The risks are reduced when outdoors, where surfaces may be subject to UV light and/or rain.



Do you know who is calling?

SCAMS

Scammers are becoming quite sophisticated and take advantage of vulnerable people.

Don't part with any of your personal information, bank cards, money or valuables. Remember:

- C**riminals may be calling. Suspect anyone you don't know, regardless of who they claim to be.
- A**nswer 'NO' to any personal questions. Don't part with any of your personal information or money. Remember, the police and your bank would NEVER ask for such details as your PIN or account numbers over the phone.
- L**eave the conversation. If you are suspicious or feel uncomfortable with the caller's questions, then end the call.
- L**et us know.

If in doubt hang up and wait 10 minutes, then report to Action Fraud: 0300 123 2843 | www.actionfraud.police.uk or the police (101)*

*Report to the police if the crime is still happening, the suspect is in the local area or if you are vulnerable and unable to contact Action Fraud.

Press on this sticker on your phone as a reminder to CALL

A genuine caller will never ask for:
- send a courier to collect cash, bank cards, or valuables
- ask for your PIN
- ask you to withdraw or transfer money

Look out for telephone callers posing as your bank, HMRC or Police officials other fraud types include postal, email, courier card fraud.

NEVER give any of your bank details out freely and **answer No** to personal questions and **If you receive a scam call contact the Police immediately.**

FOOTPATHS & HEDGES

A reminder to land/home owners that it is your responsibility to ensure hedge cutting along pavements and footpaths is done. If you are asked to clear them and do not, the Parish Council can request for Balfour Beatty do the work, they in turn will charge the owner. If you are out and about on the parish footpaths and find a problem please report it to the Footpaths Officer, Kate Lomax or the Clerk.

You can report damage, a problem or defect on the roads or footpaths in the parish in a number of ways:

Footpaths: Contact the Footpaths Officer Kate Lomax katelomax4@gmail.com or the Clerk. Alternatively you can report straight to the **Herefordshire Council Hotline on 01432 261800.**

Roads: Potholes will be logged quicker if you report them straight to **Herefordshire Council Hotline on 01432 261800.**

Alternatively, you can report problems or defects to Herefordshire Council Website—**Log on to www.herefordshire.gov.uk** and go to the highways section.

Finally, you can now download the **Hereford Council pothole reporting app to your mobile phone! Give it a go!**
